

SOME NOTES ABOUT THE PAU EXAM : Reading Comprehension

- You will be given two options. Option A and Option B. You'll be asked to choose one of them . You **cannot** mix exercises from both options

Text to read : length (approximately 14 lines)

🕒 **Three open questions (3 points).**

- • When answering them you **cannot** copy literally from the text.
- • In an open questions that requires a Yes/No answer you will be asked **to justify your answer.**
- Read the whole question **carefully** (some questions have got more than one (question)).
- Think about what that question is asking you and where that information is in the text.
- Write your answer
 - write in complete sentences
 - use part of the question stem in your answers
 - include -where necessary- evidence (details and examples) from the passage to support your answer
- Reread the question and then reread your answer
 - make sure you answered the question completely
 - make sure your answer makes sense.
 - Make sure you haven't copied literally from the text.
- Revise what you have written

Think **CUPS**

- **CAPITALIZATION** (names, places, I, beginning of a sentence, months , titles)
- **USAGE** (singular/singular, plural/plural , tenses)
- **PUNCTUATION**
- **SPELLING**

- Think **ARMS**
 - **ADD** sentences or words
 - **REMOVE** unneeded words or sentences
 - **MOVE** change a sentence or a word placement
 - **SUBSTITUTE** trade words or sentences for others (synonyms)
