EXPRESSING PREFERENCE: WOULD PREFER

• SAME SUBJECT

PREFER: used to talk about general preference

- 1. Noun +TO + Noun: *I prefer coffee <u>to</u> tea*
- 2. -ing + TO + ing I prefer skiing to swimming
- 3. + To Infinitive + RATHER THAN + Bare Infinitive I prefer to eat fish rather than (eat) meat

WOULD PREFER + TO Infinitive: to talk about specific

preference Would you like to have a cup of coffee? I'd prefer to have some water

Another clause can be introduced by <u>rather than + bare</u> infinitive:

He'd prefer to stay at home rather than drive to the restaurant

• DIFFERENT SUBJECT

<u>Prefe</u>r takes an object when we want to introduce a new subject.

I would prefer **her** to stay at home
